A Message from the Pastor...

Today is the last Sunday in Ordinary Time until June 3rd. The great 40-day retreat we call Lent begins this Wednesday. I refer to it as a “retreat” because originally this season was precisely that—40 days of final preparation for the catechumens who will be baptized, confirmed and receive Holy Communion at the Easter Vigil. (Our own catechumens will also be ramping up their preparation to receive these sacraments on April 7, the Easter Vigil.)

But Lent is for all of us. A wise person once said, “If we didn’t have a season of Lent, we would have to invent one,” meaning that we need time and space in our lives to reenergize ourselves, to root out what evils have crept in, and to strengthen our relationship with the One who suffered and died for us. Many years ago, Bishop Ken Untener, the original author of the Little Black Books, wrote that Lent is like spring cleaning, not just the ordinary dusting and vacuuming, but moving the furniture, washing walls, etc. *It allows us to see things differently.*

Annually in this season, we practice the three traditional disciplines of Lent: Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving. There are numerous opportunities to enrich our prayer life—both individually and as a community. Fasting and abstaining from meat should be more than the few days required, and it need not be only food items. Fasting from any important thing in our lives is not simply “penance,” but a way to refocus our lives on the things that really matter.

The third Lenten pillar, almsgiving, can be lived out in many ways, particularly to the poor. But I also ask you to be generous this Lent to the ACA, which benefits so many people and wonderful programs in our diocese. Last year was the most successful ACA response at St. Joe’s in many years. Our goal, established by the diocese, was very nearly reached, and the number of donors nearly doubled from the previous year. Thank you! But, as you heard in Bishop Blair’s presentation at last weekend’s liturgies, only 16% of Catholics in the diocese contribute to the ACA. Our own percentage of participation is less than that, and I truly hope that we can surpass that this year.

Another avenue for almsgiving is to bring items next weekend for our troops deployed overseas. Containers will be at the doors of the church.

Many of you have asked about my cousin, Lt. Nick Vogt, wounded in Afghanistan last November. He remains in ICU at Walter Reed Hospital in Bethesda, MD. His condition has ups and downs, although he is being weaned off a ventilator at this time. I and all his family appreciate your continued prayers.

Have a blessed and renewing Lent.

Lent - Little Black Books

For each of the next 50 days – beginning the Sunday before Ash Wednesday and concluding Easter Sunday, the *Little Black Book* presents a daily six minute meditation that will help to carry us through the twenty-four hours of each day. It is in this framework that we can enjoy one of our oldest traditions of prayer called **lectio divina** – sacred reading. In this, we take a short Scripture passage and simply let God speak to us through the words, guiding us to reflection.

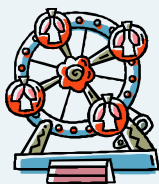

**Annual Catholic Appeal
Commitment Weekend:**

This weekend is Commitment Weekend at our parish for the 2012 Annual Catholic Appeal. 75% of funds raised over our parish goal of **\$86,844** will be rebated back to our parish. Catholic Charities is one of the areas that benefits from our contributions.

Catholic Charities

You might think of Catholic Charities as a huge safety net – always there safeguarding the physical and emotional needs of our friends, families and neighbors of all faiths – over 31,000 last year, an increase of 24% over last year. For example, your donations helped:

- ◆ Disaster relief to people who suffered serious loss. For example, when severe flooding hit northwest Ohio in March 2011, eight counties in our diocese were affected. Hardest hit were Richland and Hancock counties.
- ◆ Miriam House Transitional Housing in Norwalk provides shelter for up to two years for homeless women and their minor children.
- ◆ La Posada Family Emergency Shelter in Toledo provides temporary emergency housing for homeless families– which have been at 100% capacity for the past two years.
- ◆ Our Respect Life Ministry assist Catholics in understanding and embracing a faith-based respect for human life including areas such as abortion, euthanasia and the sanctity of human sexuality.
- ◆ Our Adoption Services program provides a variety of information about the adoption process to families who are interested in adopting or have already adopted. Additionally, it offers legally-required “home study” services to prospective adoptive families to facilitate a favorable outcome for everyone involved. Your gift to the ACA also helps Adoption Services provide post-adoption support for parents, adoptive children and siblings.
- ◆ The Healthy Beginnings/Pregnancy Support program help birth parents sort out feelings and reach decisions that are right for the baby and themselves. Assistance is provided in developing good parenting skills or in choosing an adoption plan. If parenting is chosen, the program provides counseling to prepare the birth parents for their new role as parents. If adoption is chosen, Catholic Charities offers complete, professional adoption services.

Catholic Charities has seen: an 80% increase in the number of people seeking and receiving food; and yearly growth in the need for medical and prescription services and emergency rent assistance.
