### A Message from the Pastor...

There was no column from me last week, not because I was gone or infirm or anything like that, but there is just so much going on around here, that we needed the space to highlight all the activities.

Also in last week's bulletin was a notice reminding parishioners to call our office directly when you or a family member are in the hospital. I want to emphasize that again. Even though you may tell the hospitals to notify us when you are admitted, that notification is sporadic, and some hospitals are better at it than others. So please call us. Father Ritter and I regularly visit the hospitals, sometimes four or five times per week. If you are a patient for more than 24 hours, it is rare that we would miss you. Also, if you are having a planned surgery, please call us *before the surgery* and we will be happy to celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick with you.

Among the many internet stories that I receive, I found this recent one amusing: "Where is the safest place? Statistics don't lie! How to stay safe in the world today:

1. Avoid riding in automobiles because they are responsible for 20% of all fatal accidents.
2. Do not stay home because 17% of all accidents occur in the home.
3. Avoid walking on streets or sidewalks, because 14% of all accidents occur to pedestrians.
4. Avoid traveling by air, rail, or water because 16% of all accidents involve these forms of transportation.
5. Of the remaining 33%, 32% of all deaths occur in hospitals. So, above all else, avoid hospitals.

"But, you will be pleased to learn that only .001% of all deaths occur at worship services in church, and these are usually related to previous physical disorders. Therefore, logic tells us that the safest place for you to be at any given point in time is at church! And Bible study is safe too! The percentage of deaths during Bible study is even less. So, attend church, and read your Bible. It will save your life!"

**Remembering Roe v. Wade, January 22, 1973  
Together, We Can Make a Difference**

In the 39 years since Roe v. Wade made abortion legal throughout our country there have been more than 54 million abortions. There is some good news in that both the number of abortions and the number of abortion providers have declined in recent years. Fifteen years ago there were 2,000 abortion providers; today there are 750 in existence. In the past decade, abortions in Ohio have declined by 26 percent. Pregnancy centers are making a difference. Pregnancy centers offering ultrasound services are seeing about 80 percent of the abortion-vulnerable women who come to them are ultimately choosing life.

- Pray for life—here at your church as well as down at the abortion clinics. Praying at the abortion clinics shows the women who go to them that someone cares.
